



What can CAT4 tell us?

CAT4 provides an understanding of what a student is capable of as well as identifying which of our students have the potential to achieve more and those who need support in certain subjects. For example, a student with a low quantitative score may struggle with Maths, while one with a low verbal score may find it difficult to access the curriculum. These insights help us to adapt their learning programmes in school. The CAT 4 Assessments are used to access information about your child's strengths and weaknesses. CAT assessments are also used, in combination with your son/daughters STen scores from primary school and their assessment results in second level to track your child's progress and monitor if they are performing to ability.
